1. **Biotron Project - Award of Contract**

The Property and Finance Committee has approved the award of the construction contract for the Biotron Project to Tonda Construction at \$14.4 million.

There is a projected shortfall of \$265,000 - 430,000 between the original budget and the contract amount which will be made up through a 50/50 share between the Faculty of Science budget and the VP Research budget to support CFI activities.



2. **Bank of Montreal Faculty Fellowship**

On behalf of the Board and subject to Senate approval on November 18, the Property and Finance Committee has approved establishment of the Bank of Montreal Faculty Fellowship at the Richard Ivey School of Business, under the terms of reference shown below for a period of up to nine years based on an expendable gift.



Donor and Funding: Funding for the fellowship will be provided through a generous donation of \$100,000 towards the Fellowship at the Richard Ivey School of Business from BMO Financial Group.

Funding for the Bank of Montreal Faculty Fellowship will be used to provide salary support for the appointee and to support the expenses of research and case writing.

Under University policy, an amount equal to 5% of the total cash gift will be applied to support fundraising, donor management and stewardship costs.

Effective Date: January 1, 2006

Appointment: The holder of the Fellowship will be selected by the Dean of the Richard Ivey School of Business or, at the Dean's discretion, by a selection committee. Appointments to the Bank of Montreal Faculty Fellowship will be renewable on an annual basis.

The appointed Fellow will normally be a full-time member of the faculty of the Richard Ivey School of Business.

Criteria: The role of the Fellow will be to develop innovative research and teaching materials to broaden the dissemination of the School's unique teaching and research programs. Funding will be used to provide salary support for the incumbent and to support the expenses of research and case writing.

The use of funds should be as flexible as possible with the proviso that the incumbent will consult with the Dean of the Business School in determining the exact allocation.

Reporting: The Richard Ivey School of Business will prepare a regular report for BMO Financial Group regarding the Fellow's work.

The Bill and Anne Brock Family Professorship in Child Health

On behalf of the Board and subject to approval by Senate on November 18, the Property and Finance has approved amendments to the terms for The Bill and Anne Brock Family Professorship in Child Health.



Donor and Funding: In December 2000, Bill and Anne Brock made a gift of \$1,000,000 for the establishment of a Professorship in Child Health. As of July 1, 2006, The Bill and Anne Brock Family Professorship in Child Health will be held exclusively in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry.

The amendments to the terms for this position will allow the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry to attract and retain a leader in the field of Child Health.

Funding from the endowment will be applied, at the Dean's discretion, towards salary support, partial teaching replacement for the holder of the Professorship and/or general research.

The University of Western Ontario continues to hold the endowment. The University seeks to maintain the real value of the endowment in the long run by capitalizing a portion of the investment revenue each year.

The amount available for spending each year will be a percentage of the average value of the endowment over the most recent three-year period. In any particular year, should accumulated investment returns be insufficient to fund the amount made available for spending, endowment capital will be used, with the expectation that such amounts will be recovered from future investment returns. Actual investment returns are subject to the University's fund management fees. The above is in accordance with the University's Investment Payout Policy (Policy 2.11, as may be amended from time to time).

Effective Date: July 1, 2006

Criteria: The holder of this Professorship will engage in teaching, research and clinical practice in the field of paediatric medicine and child health. Work supported by the Professorship may be related to specific paediatric illnesses or diseases, and be focused on basic science or clinical research.

Appointment: The holder of The Bill and Anne Brock Family Professorship in Child Health will be the Chair/Chief of Paediatrics in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry at The University of Western Ontario.

Reporting: The University, through the Dean of the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry and the Professor, will provide an annual written report regarding the progress and advancement of the Professor's work. In addition, a Financial Report will be provided to Mr. and Mrs. Brock regarding the status of the endowment.

"The Bill and Anne Brock Family Professorship in Child Health" will be mentioned in all publications or public activities relating to the Professor's work.

Background:

The essential amendments are as follows:

- The Professorship will now be held exclusively within the Schulich School of Medicine and Dentistry rather than jointly with the Faculty of Social Science.
- The focus of the Professorship will be Paediatric Medicine rather than Family Medicine.
- The Professor will hold the Chair in Paediatrics in the Schulich School of Medicine in Dentistry. Formerly, the Professor was jointly appointed in the Departments of Family Medicine and Psychology.

4. **Investment Committee Membership**

The Property and Finance Committee has approved the appointment of Paul Andrews to the Investment Committee for a five-year term.

1. **New Awards and Scholarships**

On behalf of the Board of Governors, the Property and Finance Committee has approved the following terms of reference for new scholarships, awards, bursaries and prizes:

Dean's Entrance Scholarships - PhD in Media Studies (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Media Studies)

Awarded to full-time graduate students who are entering the PhD in Media Studies program, based on excellent academic achievement (minimum 80% average) and outstanding research potential. The recipients will be selected by the Dean of the Faculty of Information and Media Studies in consultation with at least one faculty member who holds membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. These scholarships were established through Foundation Western.

Value: 2 at up to \$500

Effective: May 2006

Dean's Entrance Scholarships - PhD in Library and Information Science (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Library and Information Science)

Awarded to students entering a full-time graduate program in Library and Information Science, based on excellent academic achievement (minimum 80% average) and outstanding research potential. The recipient will be selected by the Dean of the Faculty of Information and Media Studies in consultation with at least one faculty member who holds membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. These scholarships were established through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at up to \$5,000 or 2 at up to \$2,500. The total expended in one year shall not exceed \$5,000.00.

Effective: May 2005

Dean's Entrance Scholarship – Master of Arts in Journalism (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Journalism)

Awarded to full-time graduate students entering the MA in Journalism program, based on excellent academic achievement (minimum 80% average) and outstanding potential in Journalism. The recipient will be selected by the Dean of the Faculty of Information and Media Studies in consultation with at least one faculty member who holds membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. Candidates must not hold another entrance award at the time of selection. This scholarship was established through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$700

Effective: May 2005

Dean's Entrance Scholarship – Master of Arts in Journalism #2 (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Journalism)

Awarded to the recipient of the David Vienneau CanWest Journalism Scholarship in the Faculty of Information and Media Studies. The recipient will be selected by the Dean of the Faculty of Information and Media Studies in consultation with at least one faculty member who holds membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. This scholarship was established through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$500

Effective: May 2005

Centre for Inclusive Education Research Awards (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Education)

Awarded to part-time or full-time graduate students enrolled in the Faculty of Education who will be completing a thesis on a topic related to the inclusive education of students with special needs. Recipients

will be selected based on their research potential and must submit an application to the Centre for Inclusive Education in the Faculty of Education by December 15. The application will consist of a cover sheet with demographic and program information, two letters of reference, a current CV, and a two-page proposal outlining the research to be undertaken. Complete application packages are available at the Centre for Inclusive Education's Web site [www.edu.uwo.ca/Inclusive Education](http://www.edu.uwo.ca/Inclusive_Education). Applications will be assessed by three members of the Centre for Inclusive Education, and at least one member of the selection committee must hold membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. These awards were established by gifts from alumni through Foundation Western.

Value: Up to 3 awards of \$750 each will be available annually
Effective: May 2005

David Vienneau CanWest Journalism Scholarship (Faculty of Graduate Studies, Journalism)

Awarded to a student in good academic standing who is beginning a full-time Master of Arts in Journalism degree program. The successful applicant will have displayed high academic achievement in a post secondary undergraduate program (a minimum aggregate average of 80% is required) and will not be the recipient of any other major award from the University in that particular academic year. The Faculty of Information and Media Studies Journalism Admissions Committee, of which at least one member is also a member of the Faculty of Graduate Studies, will select one recipient of the scholarship per academic year. This scholarship was established by The CanWest Global Foundation in memory of David Vienneau (MA Journalism '75), a leading Canadian journalist and a member of the CanWest organization from 1988 to 2004.

Value: 1 at \$3,000
Effective: May 2005

E. Jean Kunz Continuing Awards (Faculty of Health Sciences, Nursing)

Awarded to students in Year 2 of the Western - Fanshawe Collaborative Nursing program who demonstrate academic achievement (minimum 70% average) and financial need. These awards will continue in Years 3 and 4 of the recipients' degree program in Nursing, provided that the students maintain a 70% average and demonstrate financial need each year. Applications for students in the Western stream of the Collaborative program can be accessed on-line through the Office of the Registrar's Web site. Applications for students in the Fanshawe stream of the Collaborative program can be obtained through the School of Nursing. All applications must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar by October 31. The School of Nursing will select the recipients once the Office of the Registrar has determined financial need. These awards were established by a gift from the Late E. Jean Kunz (BScN '36) through Foundation Western.

Value: 3 at \$1,750, continuing for 3 years*
Effective: May 2005

**One of these awards will be designated as the E. Jean Kunz OSOTF Continuing Award and will be restricted to candidates who meet Ontario residency requirements.*

125th Anniversary Alumni Award in History (Faculty of Social Science, Department of History)

Awarded biennially to a student in an Honors Specialization, Specialization or Major in History based on academic achievement (minimum 75% average) and financial need. Applications can be accessed online through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted by October 31. The recipient will be selected by the Faculty of Social Science once financial need is determined by the Office of the Registrar. This award was established through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$450, biennial
Effective Date: May 2007

This award is offered through the Ontario Student Opportunity Trust Fund (OSOTF) program, and recipients must meet Ontario residency requirements.

Caroline Brohman Memorial Award (Richard Ivey School of Business)

Awarded to a full-time student of outstanding quality entering the Honors Business Administration program based on academic achievement (minimum 78% average) and financial need. The award will continue in HBA2 provided the student maintains an average of 75% or higher. Application deadline is April 1. The Office of the Registrar will determine financial need and the Richard Ivey School of Business HBA Scholarships and Awards Committee will select the recipient. This award was established by gifts from the family and friends of Caroline Brohman (HBA '91) and the Class of HBA '93, through Foundation Western.

Value: \$2,250 per year, continuing
Effective: May 2006

This Award is offered through the Ontario Student Opportunity Trust Fund (OSOTF) program, and recipients must meet Ontario residency requirements.

John R. Currie Award in Entrepreneurship (Richard Ivey School of Business)

Awarded to a full-time second year HBA student who is entering the HBA Entrepreneurship Certificate Stream at the Richard Ivey School of Business. Preference will be given to a Canadian student. A shortlist of potential award recipients will be determined by the Director of the Institute for Entrepreneurship based on the Entrepreneurship Stream application forms and personal interviews. Application deadline is April 1. The HBA Scholarship Review Committee will then select the award recipient in consultation with the Director of the Institute for Entrepreneurship. This award was established by John R. Currie (HBA '60) through Foundation Western.

Value: \$5,000
Effective: May 2006

James Hall Norton Memorial Award (Faculty of Science)

Awarded to a full-time student in Year 2 of an Honors Bachelor of Science degree program who is pursuing an Honors Specialization in Chemistry, or a double Major that includes both Chemistry and Biochemistry, based on academic achievement (minimum 80% average) and financial need. The award will continue in Years 3 and 4, provided that the recipient maintains the criteria outlined above and demonstrates financial need each year. If a recipient fails to retain the award, another student from the same year will be selected as a replacement. Applications can be accessed online through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted by October 31. The Faculty of Science will select the recipient. This award was established by Mrs. Ella R. Norton (BA '46) in memory of her husband Mr. James Hall Norton (BA '44, Honors Chemistry, MSc '45) through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$1,125
Effective: May 2005

Rhea A. McRae Whitty and Prof. John R. McRae Continuing Entrance Award (Faculty of Health Sciences, Nursing)

Awarded to a student entering Year 1 of the Western-Fanshawe Collaborative Nursing program, based on academic achievement (minimum 70% average) and financial need. This award will continue in Years 2, 3 and 4 of the recipient's Nursing program provided that the student maintains a 70% average and demonstrates financial need each year. If any recipient fails to qualify to continue receiving the award, another student from the same year will be selected as a replacement. Candidates must complete an admission bursary application that will be available in January of the year they apply for admission into Western. Applications for students in the Western stream of the Collaborative program can be accessed online through the Office

of the Registrar's Web site. Applications for students in the Fanshawe stream of the Collaborative program can be obtained through the School of Nursing. The Office of the Registrar will select the recipient. This award was established by a bequest from the late Mrs. Rhea A. McRae Whitty through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$1,500, continuing for 4 years
Effective: May 2005

Drs. Madge and Charles Macklin Fellowship (Faculty of Graduate Studies)

Awarded to a full-time Doctoral student registered in one of the following graduate programs: Anatomy & Cell Biology, Biochemistry, Epidemiology & Biostatistics, Medical Biophysics, Microbiology & Immunology, Pathology, Pharmacology and Toxicology, Physiology and Neuroscience. Selection will be based on excellence in teaching and research work. Academic achievement will also be considered, but a candidate's record of teaching and research is of primary importance. Candidates must apply to their Graduate Program Office by March 30. Candidates must have at least one year remaining for the completion of their degree to be eligible to apply. Candidates must apply with a CV accompanied by a letter of support from their supervisor. The Chair of each relevant graduate program will nominate one candidate. A committee consisting of the chairs of the above mentioned graduate programs and chaired by the Assistant Dean, Research (Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies, and Internationalization) will consider the nominees and select the recipient. At least one member of the selection committee will hold membership in the Faculty of Graduate Studies. Although candidates are welcome to apply for the Nellie Farthing Fellowship in addition to this fellowship, candidates cannot receive both fellowships in any given year. This fellowship was established by a bequest from Margaret Macklin Frewin (B.A. '48, Journalism) through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$6,750
Effective: May 2005

Lynn Allen Memorial Award in Nursing (Faculty of Health Sciences, Nursing)

Awarded to a full-time student who is entering year 4 of the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN) program based on academic achievement (minimum 70% average), financial need and a demonstrated commitment to Nursing. Preference will be given to a student who began his or her Nursing program at Fanshawe College. Applications can be obtained online through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted, along with an essay describing the candidate's commitment to Nursing, by October 31. The Faculty of Health Sciences' School of Nursing will select the recipient once the Office of the Registrar has determined financial need. This award was made possible by donations from the family and friends of Lynn Allen through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$500
Effective: May 2005

Essay Award for UWO Medical Undergraduates (Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Medicine)

Awarded to a student in any year of the Doctor of Medicine (MD) program who submits the best essay describing an experience managing a patient at any stage in the lifespan with a developmental disability. This includes management of physical health, mental health or both, either in the hospital system or in the community, including family medicine. The essay should be 1,500 to 2,000 words in length. Entries beyond 2,000 words will not be considered. Essays should be double-spaced, with the total word count at the top right hand corner of the first page, and must be submitted to the Coordinator of the Developmental Disabilities Division by May 31. The Developmental Disabilities Division in the Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry will select the winning essay, which will be published in the UWO Clinical Bulletin of the Developmental Disabilities Division.

Value: 1 at \$500
Effective: May 2005

Student Leader Award in Economics (Faculty of Social Science, Economics)

Awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in the fourth year of an Honors Bachelor's degree, who is enrolled in an Honors Specialization in Economics or a double Major that includes Economics. The recipient will be selected based on: academic achievement; leadership and contributions to the Department of Economics; and extracurricular activities. Applications are available from the Department of Economics and must be submitted by March 1. A committee in the Department of Economics will select the recipient. This award was established through Foundation Western.

Value: Plaque valued up to \$60
Effective: May 2005

The Athletic Club Mustangs Football Award (Any Undergraduate Program)

Awarded to a full-time undergraduate student in Year 2 or higher of any degree program who achieves a minimum average of 70% and demonstrates athletic leadership skills as a member of the Western Mustangs Football team. The Faculty of Health Sciences will select the recipient. Candidates who are varsity athletes must be in compliance with current OUA and CIS regulations. This award was established by Mr. David Wu.

Value: 1 at \$500

Dr. Glenn Walker Qualifying Program Award (Schulich School of Medicine & Dentistry, Dentistry)

Awarded to a graduating student in their final year of the Dentistry Qualifying Program who has demonstrated a high level of academic achievement (minimum 70%), leadership, interpersonal and clinical skills. The recipient will be selected by the Chair of the Dentistry Qualifying program.

Value: The School of Dentistry will inscribe the recipient's name in a plaque at the School's expense.
Effective: May 2005

Capannelli Law Professional Corporation Scholarship (Faculty of Law)

Awarded to an undergraduate student in Year 2 or Year 3 of the Faculty of Law based on academic achievement (minimum B+ average) and financial need. Preference will be given to students who have made a significant contribution to the life of the Law School. Applications can be accessed through the Office of the Registrar's Web site and must be submitted, along with a maximum 250-word essay describing the candidate's contribution to the Law School, by October 31. The Office of the Registrar will determine financial need and the Faculty of Law will select the recipient. This scholarship is made possible by Capannelli Law Corporation.

T. R. Meighen Entrance Scholarship for Students from Atlantic Canada (Any Undergraduate Program)

Change in title, criteria and value from:

Awarded annually to an outstanding secondary school student from Atlantic Canada entering year one studies at The University of Western Ontario. Candidates must have a very strong academic record, minimum 90% or in the top 10% of their class, a demonstrated ability for creative and innovative thought, a passion for learning and exceptional achievement and leadership in extracurricular activities. Application deadline is Feb 14th. This scholarship was established by a generous donation from the T.R. Meighen Family Foundation through Foundation Western.

Value: \$9500 (\$3500 for first year; \$2000 for second, third and fourth year)

To: T. R. Meighen Family Foundation Continuing Scholarship for Students from Atlantic Canada

Awarded to a student from Atlantic Canada entering first year of any program at Western who achieves a minimum 85% academic average. This scholarship will continue provided that the recipient maintains an average of 80% and a full-time course load. If a student fails to retain the scholarship, another student who meets the criteria will be selected from the same year. This scholarship was established by a generous donation from the T.R. Meighen Family Foundation through Foundation Western.

Value: 1 at \$1,500, continuing up to four years

Priority will be given to students who can provide documentary evidence that at least one of their ancestors (parent, grandparent, great-grandparent) came from a South Asian country either directly or by diaspora. These countries include: Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Tibet, Afghanistan and Bhutan. Applications can be obtained from the Faculty of Information and Media Studies and must be completed by September 30. These countries include: Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Bangladesh, India, Nepal, Tibet, Afghanistan and Bhutan. Nortel Networks Scholarships of Excellence in Information and Media Studies (Faculty of Information and Media Studies)

Change in criteria from:

Awarded annually to a full-time undergraduate student entering first year of the Media Information and Technoculture program who achieves a 90% admission average. This scholarship will continue as long as the recipient enters the honors program in Media Information and Technoculture in year 2. Recipients must maintain an 80% average and full-time course load for the remainder of the honors MIT program to retain

the scholarship. If the recipient of the continuing scholarship fails to meet these requirements, another student from the same year will be selected based on the criteria stated herein. These scholarships were made possible by a generous donation from Nortel Networks.
