

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
between
THE UNIVERSITY OF WESTERN ONTARIO
and
FANSHAWE COLLEGE

This articulation agreement establishes procedures for admission of qualified graduates of the Business-Accounting Diploma Program at Fanshawe College ("Fanshawe") into Years 3 and 4 of the Aubrey Dan Program in Management and Organizational Studies (Finance and Administration Specialization), Faculty of Social Science, The University of Western Ontario ("UWO"), and the program, progression and graduation requirements for successful applicants.

OBJECTIVES OF THE AGREEMENT

1. To provide graduates from Fanshawe who satisfy the criteria described in this agreement the opportunity to apply for admission to the Bachelor of Management and Organizational Studies Program (BMOS Program) at UWO (Main Campus).
2. To meet the needs of aspiring Certified General Accountants now enrolled at Fanshawe to complete their accounting credits and to obtain a UWO degree.
3. To attract top students to the BMOS program, thus strengthening its academic credentials and reputation.

The Parties agree as follows:

TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

1. Both UWO and Fanshawe agree to encourage qualified graduates of Fanshawe's two-year Business-Accounting Diploma program to participate by advising and informing them of the benefits of the program.
2. UWO agrees to consider for admission to full-time study in Year 3 of the BMOS (Finance and Administration Specialization) program, students from Fanshawe who have complied with the following requirements:
 - a) notified the Director of the BMOS Program by March 1 of the year in which they are seeking admission of their intention to apply, and provided UWO with academic transcripts by June 1 of that year;
 - b) completion of the two-year Business-Accounting Diploma program with a minimum overall average of "B+" or 3.5 GPA calculated on all courses within the diploma program only, and with no grade less than "C" or 2.0 GPA;
 - c) completion within the two years immediately prior to applying to the BMOS program of a prescribed set of courses within the Business-Accounting Diploma program (see table in section 3 below);
 - d) completion of Math 012a/b or Grade 12 U Advanced Functions and Introductory Calculus (MCB4U);
 - e) the written endorsement of the Chair of Business and Management at Fanshawe.

3. The required Fanshawe courses are listed below. Fanshawe students will receive “block credit” for these courses equivalent to the first two years of full-time study (10.0 courses) in the Finance and Administration Specialization module of the BMOS Program, not “advanced standing.” This credit is not transferable to other Faculties or Programs.

4. The list set out in section 3 may be amended from time to time with the agreement in writing of both parties. Each party must give the other party reasonable notice of any anticipated changes to curriculum or course content for the courses set out in section 3. If UWO determines that “block credit” cannot be given due to course or curriculum changes that have been or will be instituted by either party, it may terminate this agreement. The effective date of termination shall be the earlier of three months after written notice of termination is given to Fanshawe, or the date upon which the changes are adopted by either of the parties.
5. The total number of students registered in the program pursuant to this agreement will be restricted to a maximum of five per year. The decision as to the number of students who will be registered in any academic year is solely that of UWO, will be reviewed annually, and is not subject to appeal by unsuccessful applicants.
6. Once admitted to Year Three of the BMOS program, access to UWO courses will be attained through modification of constraints for the courses involved (with express permission of the departments concerned). Students need to complete successfully the 10 remaining courses in their program, maintaining a cumulative and graduating average of at least 65%, with no sessional average (including summer session) less than 60%. A maximum of 12 attempts at UWO is allowed. BMOS progression and degree requirements may be revised from time to time by UWO. UWO will provide Fanshawe with written notice of any revisions. Students who do not meet progression/graduation requirements for BMOS, but who do meet requirements for another program, may be eligible for transfer to another program at the discretion of the Dean of their Faculty.

7. To graduate from the BMOS program, students must successfully complete the courses¹ listed below. UWO will provide Fanshawe with written notice of any changes to these course requirements.

Year III

- Management and Organizational Studies 310a/b and 320a/b
- Management and Organizational Studies 360a/b and 361a/b
- Management and Organizational Studies 372
- Economics 150a/b and 152a/b
- One full-course or equivalent senior option from the Faculty of Arts and Humanities

Year IV

- Management and Organizational Studies 330a/b and 410a/b
- Management and Organizational Studies 460a/b and 461a/b
- One full course or equivalent from: History 143F/G, 144F/G, 146F/G; Philosophy 162F/G, 241F/G, 242F/G, 245F/G, 283F/G; Political Science 211E, 236E, 246E
- One full course or equivalent from: Actuarial Science 153; Economics 154a/b, 156a/b, 159a/b, 160a/b, 184a/b
- One designated senior essay full-course or equivalent

5. Both the BMOS Program and Fanshawe will designate a Program Representative at their respective campuses to facilitate co-ordination of this agreement.
- The Program Representatives will confer, on a regular basis, on the success of the program and other matters of mutual concern.

PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This articulation agreement is effective from the date of this agreement, and shall be reviewed every two years. In addition to the termination rights given to UWO under "Terms of the Agreement" above, either party may terminate this agreement at any time upon three months' written notice to the other party. Termination of this agreement shall not affect students who have been admitted to the BMOS program prior to the termination date.

¹Effective September 1, 2008, Western's course numbers were revised to 4 digits. As a result:
(1) MOS courses, in each case, have doubled the initial number, e.g., 310a/b is now 3310A/B, 460a/b is now 4460A/B;
(2) Economics courses that began with 1 now have a 2 added as the initial number: 2150A/B, 2152A/B, 2154A/B, etc.
(3) Actuarial Science 153 is now 2053.
(4) History 143F/G, 144F/G, and 146F/G are now numbered 2207F/G, 2213F/G and 2703F/G respectively.
(5) Philosophy 162F/G, 241F/G, 242F/G, 245F/G, 283F/G are numbered 2074F/G, 2821F/G, 2822F/G, 2730F/G and 2720F/G respectively,
(6) Political Science courses that began with 2 have doubled the initial number, i.e., 2211E, 2236E, 2246E
