



Western's Awards for Excellence in Teaching have recognized outstanding contributions by faculty to the academic development of students since 1980-81. Up to six awards may be given out annually in the following three categories: the **Edward G. Pleva Award for Excellence in Teaching**, the **Angela Armitt Award for Excellence in Teaching by Part-Time Faculty** and the **Marilyn Robinson Award for Excellence in Teaching**. In addition, one award may be given annually in the **Western Award for Innovations in Technology-Enhanced Teaching** category.

Winners receive a commemorative scroll, and recipients of the Pleva, Armitt, and Innovations in Technology-Enhanced Teaching awards also receive an inscribed gold medal. Recipients of the Marilyn Robinson award receive a framed reproduction of an artist, selected by the recipient in consultation with the Centre for Teaching and Learning.
